

SFB1530 Clinician Scientist Grants 2023

The **SFB1530 Clinician Scientist Call** aims to train early career physicians that are pursuing a career in cancer research and modern oncology, with a special focus on B cell malignancies. The fellows will receive training in various aspects of translational cancer research, such as bioinformatics, handling of laboratory animals, soft skills and “Good Clinical Practices”.

Funding: a 50% to 100% position as a clinician scientist for research only, up to 2 years in one of the research groups of the SFB1530. Start should be **01 May - 31 July 2023**.

Eligible candidates: early career physicians with a MD or PhD degree and at least one first-author publication in a peer-reviewed, international journal.

The application should include:

- 1.- Summary of the proposed project (max. 1 Page)
- 2.- Project description (max. 6 Pages): Description of planned work, preliminary results (if available), timeline/milestones, and overview of estimated costs. Project-related costs others than the clinician scientist position must be funded by the host lab or through additional third party funding. Please also add a short statement about how this project will support your career development.
- 3.- Short CV of the applicant
- 4.- A letter of support by the SFB1530 host laboratory with a commitment for providing all the infrastructure and additional funding needed.
